



There are 5 options to enroll based on your situation. Just go to midianshrine. org and click the "Pay Dues" button to sign up!

OPTION 1: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and current dues are paid. Enrollment time is January through June.

• You will pay \$30 a month for the next 6 months which will pay your next year's dues. After the 1st 6 months of \$30 you will be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 2: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and next year's dues are paid. Enrollment time is June through December.

• You will pay \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to future dues.

OPTION 3: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and pay next year's dues. Enrollment time is **June through December**.

• You will pay \$180 now plus \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 4: Pay Annual Midian Dues. No Enrollment time. This is a one-time payment and not a subscription.

• You will pay \$180 for one month which will pay your annual dues.

and slide trombone but he had to keep the trombone a secret as his father (composer of religious music) considered the instrument uncouth and sinful

Henry graduated from the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music in 1901, then traveled as a circus bandmaster. He met and married Mabel May Jones, an exotic vaudeville dancer. By 1926 he had returned to Cincinnati. There he was the conductor of the Syrian Temple Band and became head of the Fillmore Brothers Music Publishing business that was started by his father and uncle. In 1938 Fillmore 'retired' to Florida after his physician advised only a few months to live, which Henry defied by directing and composing music. He died in 1956. (There is much more about Henry Fillmore at Wikipedia.com.)
