

There are 5 options to enroll based on your situation. Just go to midianshrine. org and click the "Pay Dues" button to sign up!

OPTION 1: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and current dues are paid. Enrollment time is January through June.

• You will pay \$30 a month for the next 6 months which will pay your next year's dues. After the 1st 6 months of \$30 you will be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 2: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and next year's dues are paid. Enrollment time is June through December.

• You will pay \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to future dues.

OPTION 3: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and pay next year's dues. Enrollment time is **June through December**.

• You will pay \$180 now plus \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 4: Pay Annual Midian Dues. No Enrollment time. This is a one-time payment and not a subscription.

• You will pay \$180 for one month which will pay your annual dues.

OPTION 5: Perpetual Life Membership. No Enrollment time. Details to follow.



His name was Merle Evans, a coal miner's son from Columbus, Kansas, born December 26, 1894. He was known as the "Toscanini of the Big Top". After his circus days were through, he gave workshops and guest-led bands around the country. He was a Director of the Columbus State Bank. Evans was an honorary member of 28 Shrine Clubs. This writer heard that Evans sometimes visited Midian during the off season and directed the Million Dollar Band. Merle Slease Evans died in Sarasota, Florida on December 31, 1987.


