#### SHRINE PATIENT MOM'S LETTER OF THANKS

My mother always told me that life is like a Ferris Wheel: sometimes you are at the top, and at other times you find yourself at the bottom and in difficulty, and you have to be strong and brave. But nothing prepares you for an accident that, in a matter of seconds, turns your life around 360 degrees.

The anguish, the pain and the paralyzing fear of knowing that at any moment my son's life could be lost, is indescribable. Every minute that he survived was a victory. In Mexico, the doctors did what they could with what they had, however, the situation exceeded their capabilities and when we thought all was lost, a Shriner named Humberto Pastrana showed up at the hospital at midnight. From that moment on, he did not let go of us. He explained who he was and the institution he represented and we asked him to help us. In a matter of hours, Matias was flying to Galveston for life saving treatment. I cannot describe the emotional rollercoaster of those first few hours and days after the accident. I thought: why is this happening? Why my son? Why me? What are we going to do? And then, when the Shriners came into our lives and we arrived in Galveston, the feeling of desperation and those dark thoughts vanished.

We were welcomed by the most wonderful team of doctors; Dr. Lee, Dr. Erickson, Dr. Sanderson, nurses, therapists, who made us feel safe, cared for, loved. My son was in the very best of hands, and knowing that, it was as though the weight of the world had been lifted from my chest.

I want to thank, from the very bottom of my heart, the wonderful people that we have been so incredibly fortunate to get to know over the last two months. I want them to know that we are deeply grateful for the way they do their job in the most professional, loving and passionate way, thanks to whom our son has been gifted the opportunity of life.

And last, but certainly not least, I want to express my deepest gratitude to the Shriners and to all those who generously donate to the Shriner's Hospitals. Without them, none of these opportunities and wonderful individuals that I have just mentioned would have come into our lives. The Shriners were there for our family in our darkest hour, and generously, selflessly and lovingly came to the rescue. They have given Matias the gift of life, a future to look forward to, and the possibility of a trip back up to the top of the Ferris Wheel – none of which we thought would be possible two months ago. For that, as a mother, I am more grateful than words can adequately express.


