


We are coming up on the Sportsmen's Event on August 3rd. Get out there and sell those tickets to help Midian and to help out your Unit or Club.





Monthly Dues Payment Plans

Midian is excited to offer its members the ability to pay dues on-line or select a monthly payment plan for their dues. This is through PayPal and is very secure. You do not need a PayPal account but it's recommended. Please note that the total amount you pay is \$10 a year more than your dues. This is to help pay for the cost of this platform and you can cancel anytime. If you have a PayPal account, enter your email, if you don't click pay with credit card.

There are 5 options to enroll based on your situation. Just go to midianshrine.org and click the "Pay Dues" button to sign up!

OPTION 1: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and current dues are paid. Enrollment time is **January through June.**

• You will pay \$30 a month for the next 6 months which will pay your next year's dues. After the 1st 6 months of \$30 you will be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 2: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and next year's dues are paid. Enrollment time is June through December.

• You will pay \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to future dues.

OPTION 3: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and pay next year's dues. Enrollment time is **June through December**.

• You will pay \$180 now plus \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 4: Pay Annual Midian Dues. No Enrollment time. This is a one-time payment and not a subscription.

• You will pay \$180 for one month which will pay your annual dues.

OPTION 5: Perpetual Life Membership. No Enrollment time. Details to follow.



Other than a few lessons from the director of the Grand army Band of Canton, Karl mostly taught himself to play various brass instruments and to compose music. His first job as a professional musician was playing baritone horn with the Thayer Military Band, directed by William E. Strassner.


In 1910, 19 year old Karl began playing baritone and directing circus band. First, he

joined the Robinson Famous Shows. In 1912 he performed in the Sells-Floto Circus. Then he joined the Barnum and Bailey Circus band in 1913. During his stay with Barnum and Bailey he married Ruth Lovett.

In 1918 King hope to join John Philip Sousa at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station during World War I but Sousa had no open positions. King apply to the Army but his reporting date was the day the war ended.

King returned to Canton, Ohio and directed the local band. He started a music publishing business, K.L. King Music House in 1919 then moved to Fort Dodge, Iowa, where he lived for the rest of his life.




Motor Patrol


